Nometnes noteikumi / Camp rules

Latvian Association of Washington children's summer camp

A. Camp environs and facilities

- No persons shall cut or damage shrubs and trees, or damage or deface camp facilities and equipment.
- Fires are permitted only in designated areas. Observe burn bans as required.
- Dispose of all waste materials in designated receptacles.
- Activities on the lake are allowed only with prior permission from camp administrators and only in the company of an adult.
- Swimming in the swimming pool is permitted only in the presence of pool personnel.
- Fire regulations prohibit motor vehicle parking by, or near, the dormitories, except for short-term loading and unloading. Motor vehicles must be parked in the lot designated for that purpose.

B. Personal safety

- Use of alcoholic beverages and drugs is prohibited on camp property.
- Smoking is permitted only in designated areas, no closer than 25 feet from entrances to the dining hall; no smoking is permitted in or near dormitories.
- No camper or staff member shall leave the camp without prior permission from the camp administrator or a designated substitute.
- If staff or counselors need to leave camp, they must sign out in the camp office, noting their destination, and estimated time of return, and a cell phone number.
- Camp participants, staff and administrators with motor vehicles must carry their vehicle keys with them at all times.
- Camp participants observe, and participate, in requisite fire and other safety drills.
- All visitors must sign in at the camp office and wear a visitor's name tag while on camp premises.

C. Interpersonal relations

- Per RCW 49.60.030, discrimination because of age, sex, marital status, race, creed, color, national origin or physical or mental handicap is prohibited.
- Mežotne policies prohibit bullying, harassment, humiliation or endangerment of camp participants or facilities. Discipline measures are as follows:
 1. First instance: Camp counselor advises offender to change behavior and notifies camp administrator.
 2. Second instance: Camp administration contacts parent, and camper is dismissed from camp. Children expelled from camp will not receive consideration for participation in the following year. There is no reimbursement of camp fees. Parents will be held financially responsible for any damage to camp facilities and property.
